Behaviour

The parents are directly responsible for the care of their child unless it is scheduled training or during football games



Child safety standards

Child Safety Officer

As part of AFL Victoria's Child Safe Policy, every junior football/netball club is required to have a Child Safety Officer.

This person is the initial point of contact for any report of child abuse (physical, emotional verbal, etc). Every child within our club should be made aware that the Child Safety Officer is a person that they can speak to if they are feeling unsafe. Redan JFNC's Child Safety Officer is John Litras

Working with Children Checks (WWCC)

Anyone working directly with children under 18 must have a current WWCC – this includes parents of children taking part if they are doing a regular role within the organisation.

All staff/volunteers at RFNC must ensure their WWCC is linked to our club. The club postal address will be used to link your card. PO Box 437, Ballarat 3353

Code of conduct

The code of conduct outlines the expected behaviour at our club Players

- 1. Abide by the rules of the game and rules set down by your coach, club and league.
- 2. Never argue with an official or umpire. If you disagree, have your captain, coach or manager approach the official during a break or after the match.
- 3. Control your temper. Verbal or physical abuse of officials, umpires, spectators or other players, deliberately distracting or provoking an opponent is not acceptable or permitted.
- 4. Work equally hard for yourself and your team. Your team's performance will benefit so will you.
- 5. Be a good sport. Applaud all good plays whether they be by your team, opponent or the other team. Be proud to walk off the ground after each game knowing that you have given your best effort and never involve yourself in an argument with opposing players, umpires or officials.
- 6. Treat all players as you would like to be treated. Do not interfere with, bully or take unfair advantage of another player. Your involvement to play is for fun and enjoyment and that winning is only part of it.
- 7. Co-operate with your coach and team mates, and respect the ability of your opponent. Without them there would be no game.
- 8. Always show respect for Umpires and respect decisions made even if you do not agree with the outcome.
- 9. Play for the 'fun of it and not just to please parents and coaches.
- 10. Avoid use of derogatory language based on gender or race. Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of the gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- 11. Agree to abide by your League's policies as listed on the website and in the information booklet and operations manual.
- 12. Do not take part in any form of bullying including via the use of social media. For more information they should see their state, league or national Member Protection Policy.
- 13. Be prepared to be responsible for your actions



Code of conduct

Parents/Guardians & Supporters

- 1. Encourage children to participate if they are interested. However, if a child is not willing do not force them.
- 2. Focus upon the child's efforts and performance rather than the overall outcome of the event. This assists the child in setting realistic goals related to their ability by reducing the emphasis on winning.
- 3. Teach your child that honest effort is as important as victory so that the result of each game is accepted without undue disappointment.
- 4. Encourage your child always to play by the rules.
- 5. Never ridicule or yell at your child for making a mistake or losing a competition.
- 6. Remember your child should be involved in Football/Netball for their enjoyment, not yours.
- 7. Remember your child learns best by example. Applaud good play by both your team and by members of the opposing team.
- 8. If you disagree with an official or umpire raise the issue through the appropriate channels rather than questioning the official's judgment and honesty in public. Remember, most officials give their time and effort for your child's involvement.
- 9. Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from junior sporting activities.
- 10. Recognise the value and importance of volunteer coaches. They give their time and resources to provide recreational activities for your child and deserve your support.
- 11. Support your club officials in maintaining the highest standard of behaviour both on and off the field for the betterment of the league and your family. Offer your assistance to the team that your child is playing in so that every opportunity is being provided for the very best supervision and support. Your involvement will give both yourself and your child far more satisfaction.
- 12. Avoid use of derogatory language based on gender or race. Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of the gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- 13. Agree to abide by your League's policies as listed on the website and in the information booklet and operations manual.
- 14. Do not take part in any form of bullying including via the use of social media. For more information they should see their state, league or national Member Protection Policy.
- 15. Be prepared to be responsible for your actions.

NOTE: League policies can be viewed online via your League's website RFNC and the League are committed to ensuring that natural justice and privacy of people involved in any breach are dealt with sensitively, irrespective of the alleged breach to the Code of Conduct. Any breaking of the code of conduct will not be tolerated and will result in sanctions being imposed by the club

Communication App


Redan football club communicates all-important information through Team app. This is an online application that can be downloaded to your smart phone. All parents and players are encouraged to download this free app and register for the applicable age level. Team App is the primary communication tool used to cancel / change training and for important club information.



Complaints and Compliment's

Game day complaints

Game day complaints should be raised with the RJFNC game day ground manager. No members of RFNC should raise a concern with umpires or players directly.

Development Programs

RFNC runs an introduction program to football and netball, incorporating skill activities, minor games, and modified matches. The programs are delivered in a fun and safe environment. The weekly program is coordinated by accredited coaches to ensure all participants have an enjoyable experience, while developing fundamental life skills.

Auskick

To be eligible for Auskick children must be primary school aged 5 to 12 (Children must turn 5 in the calendar year to participate)

Net Set Go

To be eligible for Net set go children must be 5 to 10 years old

Equipment

- Care must be taken when using the facilities and equipment when playing or training at any venue.
- No equipment is to be removed or damaged from the RFNC
- Players will be liable for the cost of replacing damaged or missing equipment
- Please report any damage immediately to coaches, team managers or committee member



Finals Policy

Injury

It is the responsibility of all players (or their parents/guardians) to ensure they are fit to play.

Players must advise the team coach of any of any illness and injuries that may affect their ability to play. It is the player's responsibility to make the coach or team manager of any injury that occurs during training or on game day.

RFNC will provide a registered trainer on game day

The RFNC recommends that private medical insurance and/or ambulance cover be taken out by all parents. If an injury is deemed serious enough club trainers will not hesitate to call an ambulance if required. RFNC does not cover ambulance fees.

Registration

- All players and official must be registered in SportsTG. https://passport.sportstg.com//login/ This includes trainers, mentors and runners
- Registration and fee payment of existing Redan junior players is to be completed online via SportsTG prior to registration day.
- Where online payment is not possible, full fee payment should be completed on Registration day. If full payment is not possible, a parent/guardian must contact the Club Secretary or Registration officer to organise a payment plan. If insufficient, or no payment or discussion has been made by Round 1, RJFNC has the right to withdraw club registration.
- The cut off for the registration of new and returning players will be at the end of round 4. Any exceptions to this rule will be at the discretion of the Club Executive. All player payments are expected to be fulfilled by round 1 unless a payment plan has been arranged with the registrar.
- All netballers must also be registered with VNA (Now known as Netball Victoria Memberships).
 Each player, coach and umpire must have VNA before they step on the court. VNA this year need to be done by the player online. Netball Victoria's online registration sign up form is now active:
 http://vic.netball.com.au/nvregistration/ Once registered, you will receive confirmation via email as well as payment receipt from PayPal. These two receipts can be used as proof of membership. VNA must be paid before commencement of the season
- Any players that are not registered will not be permitted to take part in any game. This is part of the BFNL bylaws.
- Once players are registered medical details must be update in Care monkey

Roles and Responsibilities

There are a multiple roles and responsibilities at the RFNC not defined in this booklet. They are being developed in conjunction with the AFL guide.

Runner

The runner's job is to assist the coach on match day by delivering messages to players during the match. They must not loiter on the ground or interfere with any players or officials throughout the game

Smoking

Redan football netball club is a smoke free club. The law requires the following areas to be Smoke Free during organised underage sporting events

- Club and social rooms
- Changing rooms
- Indoor spectator viewing areas
- Eating areas
- Near entries and exits of buildings, facilities, and the ground.
- Administration and office areas
- Toilet blocks
- Playing areas
- Grandstands and spectator viewing areas

Under section 5R(1) of the Tabaco act 1987, smoking is banned within 10 metres of a sporting venue that is an outdoor public place during an organised underage sporting event. This ban includes junior training or practice session.

Redan asks that all their members and spectators respect this law and the clubs requirement to adhere to the legislation.



Social Media

If choosing to engage with social media in reference to the RFNC, it is expected any references or post will be in support and promotion of the Club. Any negative posting regarding teammates, coaches or the club as a whole, may see the player responsible suspended. RFNC encourages you to follow the *Redan Junior Football/Netball* Facebook page

Team Manager

- You are encouraged to ask your team manager any questions you have that arise throughout the season. If they do not know they will find out.
- Team managers will ensure all off field football matters are dealt with efficiently and in a timely manner for the team manager's grade of competition.
- They provide administrative support to the coach and any football staff.
- They arrange the required support staff for games to take place.
- They support the coaching staff to make sure the required administrative and support arrangements are in place so that coaches and players can concentrate on the game

Time Keeper

Each match/game the Redan Football Netball club is required to provide a timekeeper. They are the official keeper of time for the duration of the match. The time keeping schedule will be supplied on the day. Time keepers are also expected to keep the score with the exception of U/9 football where no scoring is required. This will be a volunteer role



Training

- Players are expected to attend **ALL** training as requested by the coach.
- Players should arrive 10 minutes prior to training
- Players should also dress appropriately for training.
- If unable to attend training, players should contact their coach ASAP
- If training is to be cancelled a notification will come out on team app
- Parents or Guardians are requested to collect players at the completion of training. It is not the responsibility of any coach, team manager or other parents to remain with your child following training. Please ensure pick up is in a timely manner.
- Under no circumstances should any player leave the club premises during training without permission from coach or team manager

Uniform

Football

Jumpers

- A jumper will be allocated to you prior to the commencement of the season. You can nominate to
 receive a specific number however this may not always be granted. Top age players will be given
 number preference. It will be your responsibility to ensure this jumper is washed each week and
 that it is returned to your team manager on the final game for the season. A failure to return your
 jumper may result in a fee and failure to register the following season until jumper has been
 returned. It is also expected that your jumper is returned in reasonable condition.
- Game day jumpers are only to be worn on game day. They are not to be worn to training
- Anything worn under jumpers must not be visible
- Under 17 players are encouraged to wear a short sleeved jumper however there will be some long sleeved jumpers available under the discretion of the team manager

Shorts

- Maroon/Gold Vic country are the clubs home shorts
- White/Gold/Maroon is the clubs away shorts. We are still to confirm if the Under 9's are required to have away shorts for match day.
- During matches players can wear flesh coloured skins under their shorts. No other colours will be tolerated.

Socks

Maroon Socks with the BFL Logo. These can be purchased from the club

Other

- Gloves can be worn in junior football however unless for medical reason they are not encouraged in the U12 and above age groups at RJFNC
- Mouth guards are compulsory. Players will not be allowed to take the field if they do not have a mouth guard. Redan football netball club will not be liable for any injury that may occur as a result of not wearing a mouthguard. If you have health insurance check with your fund as in some cases the cost in minimal or there is no cost involved.
- Helmets According to the Australian Football match policy there is no strong evidence to suggest protective head gear is necessary in junior football.



Netball

Dresses

- A netball dress will be allocated to you prior to the commencement of the season. It will be your responsibility to ensure this dress is washed each week and that it is returned to your team manager on the final game for the season. A failure to return your dress may result in a fee and failure to register the following season until it has been returned. It is also expected that your dress is returned in reasonable condition.
- Girls may wear a plain long sleeved white t-shirt on days of extreme cold

Briefs

- Plain Maroon briefs are to be worn
- Under 9 & 11's can wear long black skins on days of extreme cold

Socks

• White BFNL approved socks

All

Hair

- All long hair is to be tied up neatly off the face
- For netballers only team coloured ribbons will be accepted

Others

- Trainer All white
- Water Carries Blue named shirt
- Runners Pink named shirt
- Mentor top Purple top
- Volunteer umpire Lime yellow shirt
- Ground Manager Orange vest

If you have been asked to fill one of these roles the correct attire will be supplied to you by your team manager.

Volunteers

- The success of the club is reliant on parent/family involvement. A condition of your child playing
 with Redan Football Netball Club is that parents/families or guardians will assist in canteen and
 other duties. Failure to assist in this way may result in your child's non-selection the following week
 or the player sitting out on game day until the duty is fulfilled
- Your team manager will provide a roster and you will be required to assist multiple times
 throughout the season. If you are not able to volunteer on the day that has been allocated to your
 family it is your duty to find a replacement. Please notify your team manager ASAP to assist you
 with this
- Volunteers must be over the age of 16 and we welcome any member of your family. The exception to this is the water carriers.
- If you are rostered to canteen duty your shift will start at the beginning of the game prior to your child's game. It ends at the start of your child's game. Please ensure you arrive in a timely manner to ensure everyone gets the start of their child's game. U11 Canteen volunteers are required from 7:30am -8am.
- Volunteers representing Redan Football Netball Club must conduct themselves according to the Players, Parents and Supporters & Officials Code of Conduct.



Watercarriers Football A minimum of 2 water carriers are required each match with the exception of under 9's. Water carriers must be of sufficient age that they do not pose a risk to themselves and others. They are required to run water to players, umpires and remove themselves from the playing area immediately. A water carrier must not remain on the field if they are not handing out water. Any person wanting to participate in this role can speak to the ground manager or team manager. They must be wearing the water carrier shirt
